Module I May 31st-June 12

Full Field School May 31-June 26

The 2010 Lighthouse Archaeological Maritime Program (LAMP) Field School at the St. Augustine Lighthouse & Museum will focus on the continuing testing of an unidentified ballast pile to make a determination whether it represents the remains of the Confederate privateer *Jefferson Davis*, lost on the St. Augustine bar in August 1861 after the most successful privateer cruise of the entire war. Alternate sites will also be investigated, including an unidentified shipwreck discovered during last year's survey. Students will be instructed in scientific diving procedures, archaeological recording and excavation, the use of hydraulic probes and induction dredges, marine remote sensing survey and analysis (magnetometer & sidescan sonar), artifact analysis, collection and documentation, and basic conservation laboratory methodology. The field school will also host an evening lecture series featuring field school instructors and visiting professionals from various public, private, and academic institutions throughout Florida and beyond.



The Field School is divided into two modules but students are encouraged to take both. Students who can only attend for two weeks (May 31-June 12) may take Module I only. The cost for Module I is \$700.00 or \$800.00 for students not taking it for credit. Students taking both modules (May 31-June 26) pay \$1,100.00 if taking them for credit or \$1,300.00 if not. This base fee includes housing and board, all diving gear (other than Mask, fins, snorkel, & booties), air fills, local transportation, and use of LAMP's research vessels, dive locker, classroom, and laboratory facilities.
